





1943. Hitler decided to destroy London. He ordered the construction of La Coupole of Helfaut: a concrete dome 5 metres thick, which protected the biggest underground V2 rocket launch pad ever built. This gigantic bunker, dug into chalk by Russian and Polish prisoners, is still intact. Today, it houses an astonishing history centre on war and rockets, where you can discover two major themes.

Northern France in German hands (REX tour)

On 10th May 1940, the German army invaded Northern France. Daily life then became one of exodus, deprivation, resistance and terror,

These are the "DARK YEARS" of history. They lasted up until 1944.

Reconstructions, rare objects, often shown for the first time, and authentic objects, La Coupole will enable you to relive and discover, with emotion, these years of Occupation which were so difficult in Northern France.

Hitler's secret weapons and the conquest of space (CINEAC tour)

In 1944, the V1s, then the V2s of von Braun spread terror over London and Antwerp. These rockets were built by the deported of the concentration camp. Dora. in Germany.

If La Coupole had never been abandoned, in July 1944, the launching rate would have reached 50 V2s per day!


When the war was over, the liberators recovered German engineers from both East and West. Between the Soviets and Americans, the space race began. The Saturn V rocket, developed by von Braun, enabled Man to take the very first step on the moon.

From war to the moon, from dark years to light years, La Coupole relates the history of these deadly machines, from an angle never yet approached, ironically paving the way for the conquest of space, today a source of co-operation and progress between nations.



La Coupole invites you to take an incredible voyage into the heart of history and science.

With the help of modern technology and faithful reconstructions, you will discover what daily life was like during the German occupation in Northern France, as well as Hitler's secret weapons and the first steps in the conquest of space.

The unique site of La Coupole is an impressive testament to the past. Since its opening in May 1997, it has had over 400,000 visitors.

So, hold your breath and prepare to enter one of the most crucial phases in our history.



After exploring the main underground gallery, you ride up 42 m in a lift under the concrete dome. 2 visiting circuits await you, with access via the 2 cinemas.

The German secret weapons and the Total War

During the Second World War, the Nazi engineers developed a revolutionary weapon: the V2. As the first stratospheric rocket in history, the V2 rapidly became a top priority arms programme for Hitler, who saw in this rocket the means of destroying London and of reversing the course of the war by striking at the very symbol of resistance to Nazism.

The building of La Coupole started in 1943 and it was designed to be the launch base for this new weapon. In this gigantic bunker, which is today transformed into a memorial and history centre, you can follow the development programme of the V1 and V2 secret weapons as well as their military use during the conflict.


The conquest of space

Immediately after the Second World War, the Cold War began between the Soviets and the Americans. After the Cuban missile crisis in 1962 and the advent of peaceful co-existence, the conflict moved to the field of space conquest and a technology race started up between the two great powers.

Wernher von Braun and his team, who were V2 rocket designers in Nazi Germany and who rallied to the American cause in the final weeks of the War, were also the engineers of Saturn V which took Man to the moon. It is this fascinating period of the race to conquer space, the most important

human enterprise of the 20th century, that is presented to you at La Coupole, using the most up-to-date museographic techniques.

Period reconstruction

On 10th May 1940, the German army invaded the North of France. Then began « the dark years »: a time of privation, terror and resistance for the occupied populace. Using rare documents, La Coupole retraces this painful past: period films, reconstruction of the interior of workers' dwellings, shop fronts, the firing squad execution wall from the Lille citadel, a real Free French Forces Citroën Traction...

So many testaments which enable us to relive and discover the daily life of the inhabitants of Nord/Pas-de-Calais under the occupation.
